# What are SATs?

- ▶ In May, most pupils in year six will take the key stage 2 (KS2) national curriculum tests – commonly known as SATs (Standard Assessment Tests).
- ▶ These tests, alongside teacher assessment of English writing and science, are used to measure school performance and to make sure individual pupils have the support that they need as they move into secondary school.
- ▶ They are sat under formal exam conditions and each exam is strictly timed.

- ▶ This year they run from Monday 13th May - Thursday 16th May

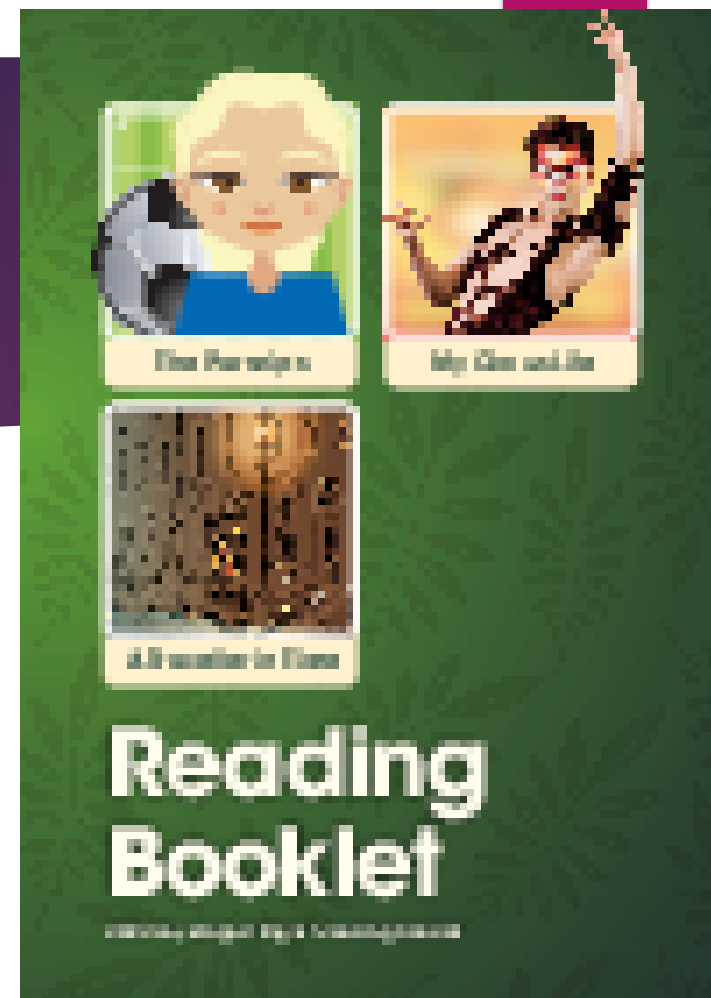

# How are the SATs marked?

- ▶ The SATs papers are collected from school and marked externally.
- ▶ We then receive the results as a school and these are reported to you as part of the children's end of year school reports.
- ▶ Each paper is out of a certain amount of marks (raw score). This raw score is then converted to a scaled score.
- ▶ The National Standard is a scaled score of 100 to be working at age related.
