How we safeguard your children

SEN Support

Some children in our school have specific or additional needs that we cater for with our skilled Support staff led by Mrs Boley our SENDCO.

Mrs Cutts works 2 days a week alongside Mrs Boley as our Assistant SENDCO.



Our Nurture room has been developed for those children who are not always able to work within the busy classroom environment- this has proven to be very successful and it is also home to our therapy pet- Mr Oreo.

In the first instance of your child being identified with a need or a gap in their learning they will receive some additional support within the classroom and may take part in some interventions to close the gap.

Next if there is still a need for further support they will be put onto a one plan with some targets to achieve.



Mental Health and Well Being

Our Calm Cabin has been set up by Mrs Fletcher and she has created a calm and tranquil space for the children she works with during the afternoons.

This is for children who may have anxieties about something at school or at home or for those who need their self esteem and confidence built up

They go out on mini expeditions, grow their own flowers and veg and sometimes just doodle or escape with a book or music.

Additionally to this, one afternoon a week we have a play therapist in school to work with children who may need this kind of support- we would need parental permission for this if we identified a need.

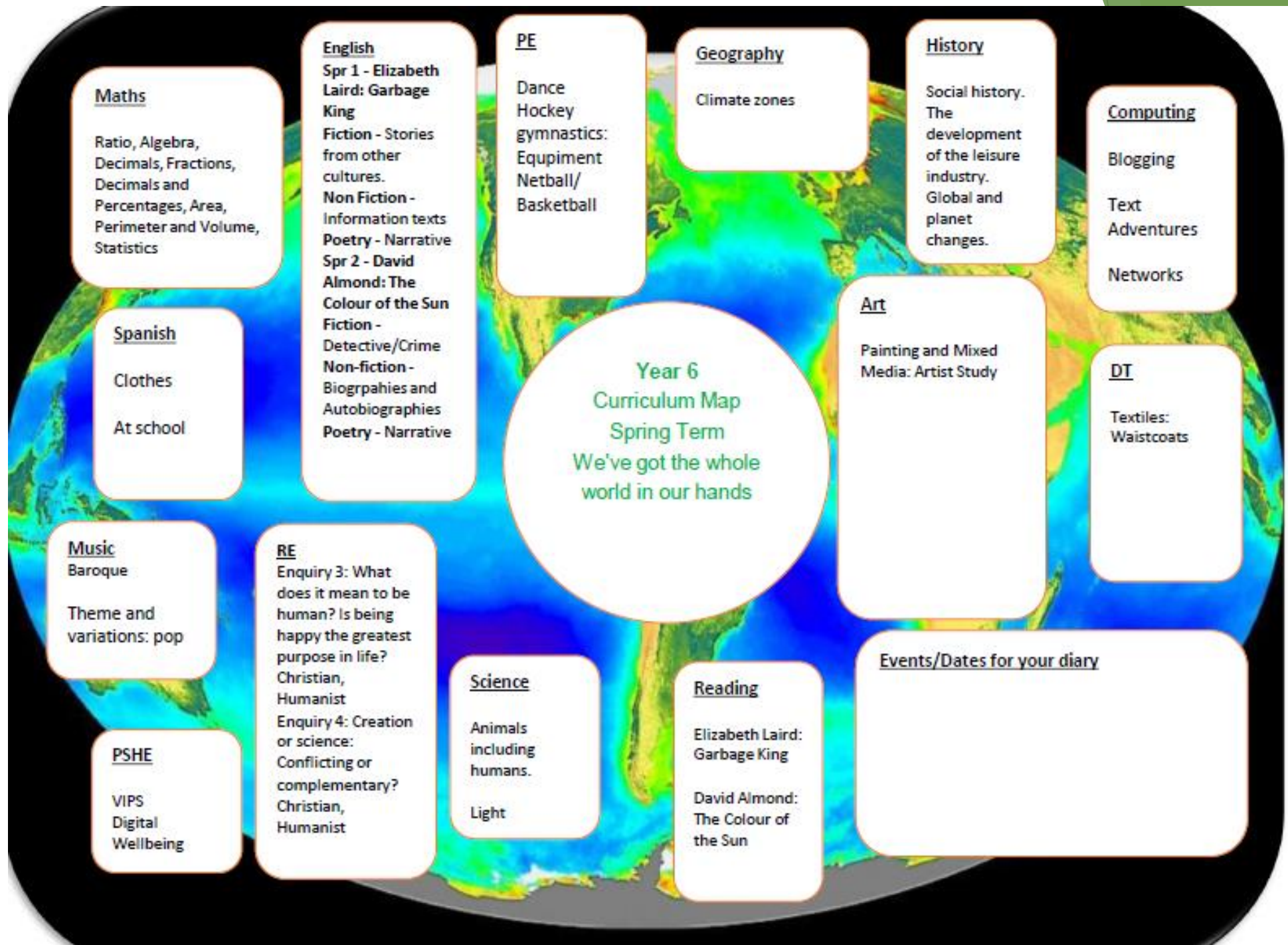

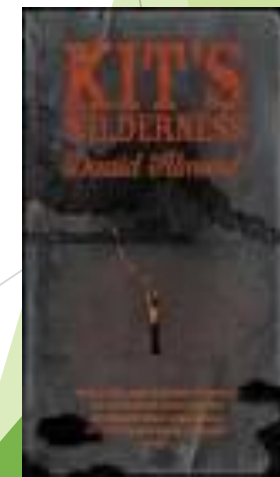

By Year 6, children should know all their times tables (and the related division facts) up to 12x12. We will be continuing to support those children who are not secure with these yet. The children all have their own Times Tables Rock Stars log in which they access both in school and at home.

PSHE

Over the year, we will be covering a range of topics during these lessons.

In the second half of the Autumn term we will be covering our Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) unit.

During this unit, we will be exploring these questions:

1. What are the changes that occur in boys' and girls' bodies during puberty? How can we look after our bodies as we grow?
2. How might our thoughts and feelings change during puberty? How can we deal with difficult feelings and moods?
3. Is there an ideal kind of body? What information can affect how we think and feel about ourselves and our bodies?
4. What is a loving relationship? What kinds of loving relationship are there?
5. What is a sexual relationship and who can have one? What is an STI and how can they be prevented? What type of physical contact is unacceptable and how should we respond?
6. How is a baby conceived? What is contraception? How does a baby grow? How is a baby born?

RE

Over the year, our units that we will cover in RE are:

- How and why does religion bring peace and conflict? (Multi)
- How do Buddhists explain the suffering in the world? (Buddhist)
- What does it mean to be human? Is being happy the greatest purpose in life? (Christian, Humanist)
- Creation or science: conflicting or complementary? (Christian, Humanist)
- How do beliefs shape identity for Muslims? (Muslim)

Spanish- KEY STAGE 2

Last year in our Modern Foreign Languages lessons we made the switch from French to Spanish. The reason for this is due to us identifying that children in our school are more likely to use Spanish in the future than French and it is also in line with our local secondary school too.

Children in Key Stage 1 will learn simple greetings etc but it is not a formal lesson in KS1.
